Volunteers pick-up Food from the Greater Cleveland Food Bank twice a month.

First pick-up is usually what the Federal and State Government suggests we hand out.

Second pick-up is for all other items including, but not limited to, perishable items, such as meats, fruits, and vegetables.

<u>Every</u> person who Volunteers at Our Savior's Food Panty is a true Volunteer. No one is paid for their time.

Donations and volunteers are always needed and gratefully received.



When you arrive, you will be asked to show your id. You will receive a number which will be called when it is your turn to sign for and receive food. You will need to:

- 1. Provide a picture identification, such as a valid driver's license or government issued Photo ID.
- Provide proof of residency, such as valid driver's license, current utility bill, or bank statement, showing home address from either Gates Mills, Highland Heights, Mayfield Heights or Mayfield Village.
- 3. Provide your telephone number.
- 4. Indicate your income level.



- Once a Year the Federal and State Government requires us to see at least one person from each household.
- Yes you can pick up food for someone else, providing that we have previously seen them in person and you have a written permission slip signed by that person and their government issued photo id.
- Everyone that signs for food is certifying that the information provided is true and that you understand that making a false certification may result in having to pay the State for the value of the food improperly issued and may subject you to criminal prosecution under State and Federal law.
